

CHCI Semester 1 Final Evaluation Information *Evaluation Days*

January 23, & 26-28, 2026



The WRDSB has divided the 10 evaluation days in a 1-4 day split each semester, as shown on the <u>secondary school year calendar</u>. The four days occurring at the end of each semester will allow staff to support and administer a variety of final evaluation tasks and determine a grade for students. The evaluation period for the end of semester 1 will occur from January 23-28, 2026. The 70% term / 30% final evaluation split is an opportunity to take stock of student learning and use assessment practices in service of fair and reliable evaluation that aligns with <u>Growing Success</u>. Classroom teachers will clearly communicate with their students and their families what they need to be doing on these days.

There is an expectation that students complete all parts of a course's final evaluation. Please do not plan events which require your student to be absent from school on these days or on the days directly following the evaluation period. Students who do not complete their final 30% (in its various forms) do not take advantage of the opportunity to provide recent evidence to demonstrate their learning and growth and to confirm their consistent level of performance and grasp of overall expectations which is used when determining their final grade. If a student does not provide some significant evidence in the form of a final evaluation (e.g. assignment, lab, presentation, performance task, etc.), it may result in the student attaining a reduced grade and/or failure based on the overall evidence as reflected in the term work and final evaluation components.

ACE students will attend school with regular programming.

30% Final Evaluation: A variety of methods may be used for evaluation tasks, including performance-based tasks, portfolios, research projects, essays, demonstrations, projects, exit interviews, conferences, exams, etc. Final evaluations take place toward the end of the course on regular school days and on the designated Evaluation Days.

Scheduled Final Evaluations January 23, & 26-28: Students in all grades 9-12 may have timed final evaluation tasks during the Evaluation Days that are part of the 30% final evaluation for their courses. These evaluations will be a maximum 75 minutes in length. If required, students may have up to double the allotted time (up to 150 minutes) to complete the evaluation. This aligns with EQAO testing. See list of scheduled final evaluations on the next page.

Credit Rescue Opportunities: Some students will be invited to attend on the Evaluation Days to complete their demonstration of expectations in order to earn their credit.

Student Attendance: During Evaluation Days, students are only required to be in school when they have a scheduled in-person final evaluation or when they have been asked by their teacher to attend. Attendance will be taken and submitted for scheduled evaluation tasks including performance-based tasks, portfolios, research projects, essays, demonstrations, projects, exit interviews, conferences, exams, in-person credit rescue, leveling-up opportunities, etc.

Study Areas: Students cannot be studying / congregating / wandering in our hallways. The library will be open for those who wish to engage in quiet study. The cafeteria will also be open for those who wish to work collaboratively together.

SCHOOL CLOSURES or TRANSPORTATION CANCELLATIONS:

- School buses run on their regular schedule during the evaluation days.
- Listen to local radio and check the school board social media channel/website at wrdsb.ca and the school website chc.wrdsb.ca by 6:30 a.m.
- Evaluations may be postponed for various reasons including school closures, transportation cancellations, plant
 malfunctions, etc. Please do not plan events which require your student to be absent from school on these days
 or on the days directly following the evaluation days as these will be the days in which the postponed evaluations
 will be rescheduled.
- If <u>any</u> WRDSB Secondary School is closed or school transportation is cancelled due to inclement weather, ALL high school evaluations will move forward by one day. (i.e. the final evaluations scheduled for Friday, January 23rd would be shifted to Monday, January 26th, Tuesday the 27th move to Wednesday the 28th, etc.)
- The Thursday January 29, 2026 PD day will not change if there are weather or school closure disruptions. If evaluations are postponed by a day, evaluations from Wednesday the 28th will move to Friday, January 30th.

Report Cards: Report cards for Semester 1 will be distributed to students the week of February 9, 2026.

Scheduled evaluations will be a maximum of 75 minutes in length. If required, students may have up to double time (150 minutes) to complete the evaluation.

Students could be required by their teachers to be present during the morning block in classes that do not have a scheduled final evaluation to complete individual evaluation or credit rescue opportunities. Teachers will communicate this to students and families individually. Attendance will be taken for the scheduled evaluations and for those students who have been asked to be present for the morning block by their teachers.

Students could be required by their teachers to be present during this time to complete forms of evaluation or complete credit rescue opportunities. Students are only required to be in school when they have been asked by their teacher to attend. Attendance will be taken for those students who have been asked by their teacher to attend.

Teachers are available during this time to answer student questions and support student work completion including credit rescue opportunities for students from any of their classes. This time provides an opportunity for students to work with teachers (ask questions, complete work) from any of their classes in locations indicated by their teachers.
