- Publicly funded high school

## ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

### In order to earn an OSSD a student must:

- Earn 30 credits (18 compulsory and 12 optional)
- Complete two e-Learning courses
- Complete 40 hours of community involvement activities
- Successfully complete the provincial secondary school literacy requirement

### Compulsory Credits

- 4 English (one per grade)
- 3 Mathematics
  - at least one in Grade 11 or 12

- 2 Science
- 1 French as a Second Language
- 1 Canadian Geography
- 1 Canadian History
- 1 Arts
- 1 Health and Physical Education
- 0.5 Career Studies and 0.5 Civics

**GROUP 1:** 1 additional credit in English or French as a second language\* or a Native language or Classical or International language or Social Science and Humanities or Canadian & World Studies or Guidance & Career Education, or Cooperative Education\*

**GROUP 2:** 1 additional credit in Health and Physical Education or Arts or Business Studies or French as a Second Language\* or Cooperative Education\*

**GROUP 3:** 1 additional credit in Grade 11 or 12 Science or Grades 9-12 Technological Education or French as a Second Language\* or Computer Studies or Cooperative Education\*

\*A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education and French as a Second Language can count as compulsory credits.

\*\*Students who pursue an International Baccalaureate Diploma must earn two diplomas, the OSSD and the IB diploma. Thus they must meet the requirements for both diplomas.

- In Grades 9 and 10, students participate in an IB Studies Programme that:
  - Covers the Ontario curriculum at an accelerated rate
  - Familiarizes students with the IB Programme Approaches To Teaching and Learning
  - Students learn in a dynamic classroom atmosphere enriched with:
    - Inquiry-Based Learning
    - Differentiation
    - Internationalism
- Students may continue into the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme if they maintain an acceptable average in their Grade 9 and 10 credits.



Diploma candidates are required to complete six subjects:

one subject from each of the following groups:

- Group 1 Language A: English Lit (HL)
- Group 2 Language B:
  - French or Spanish Ab Initio (SL)
- Group 3 Individuals and Societies (one of):
  - History of the Americas (HL)
  - Psychology (HL)
- Group 4 Experimental Sciences (one of):
  - Biology (HL)
  - Chemistry (HL)
- Group 5 Mathematics and Computer Studies:
  - Math Analysis and Approaches (SL)
- Group 6 The Arts (or one of the following):
  - Visual Arts (SL)
  - Chemistry (SL)
  - Physics (SL)
  - Business Management (SL)

### SAT EXAMINATION

CHCI Students are provided information about writing the SATs. However, no additional preparation is undertaken for these tests as most of our students attend Canadian universities.



- The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) is a specialized high school program.
- It allows students to:
  - Earn their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
  - Focus learning on a specific economic sector
  - Benefits of the SHSM program include:
    - Developing skills for future careers
    - Graduating high school with industry certifications and training
    - Earning an SHSM seal on their high school diploma
- To complete an SHSM, students must:
  - Complete a specific bundle of 8-10 courses in their selected field
  - Earn industry certifications (e.g., first aid and CPR)
  - Gain on-the-job skills through cooperative education placements
- When students complete an SHSM, they will get:
  - a high school diploma with an embossed SHSM seal
  - a SHSM record that has details of credit bundle, certifications, placements and other experiences
  - formal recognition on their Ontario Student Transcript
- Cameron Heights offers the following sectors:
  - Arts & Culture
  - Manufacturing
  - Sports
  - Information & Communication Tech
  - Transportation

## INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

- Cameron Heights has been an accredited member of the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme since 2002.
- It is the first publicly funded school to offer the IB Programme to secondary school students in the Region of Waterloo.
- Each year, over 400 students apply to the Cameron Heights pre-IB Programme.
- The IB Admissions Committee reviews applications and accepts 220 students who demonstrate:
  - Good and Excellent work habits & study skills
  - Strong academic potential
  - Intellectual curiosity
